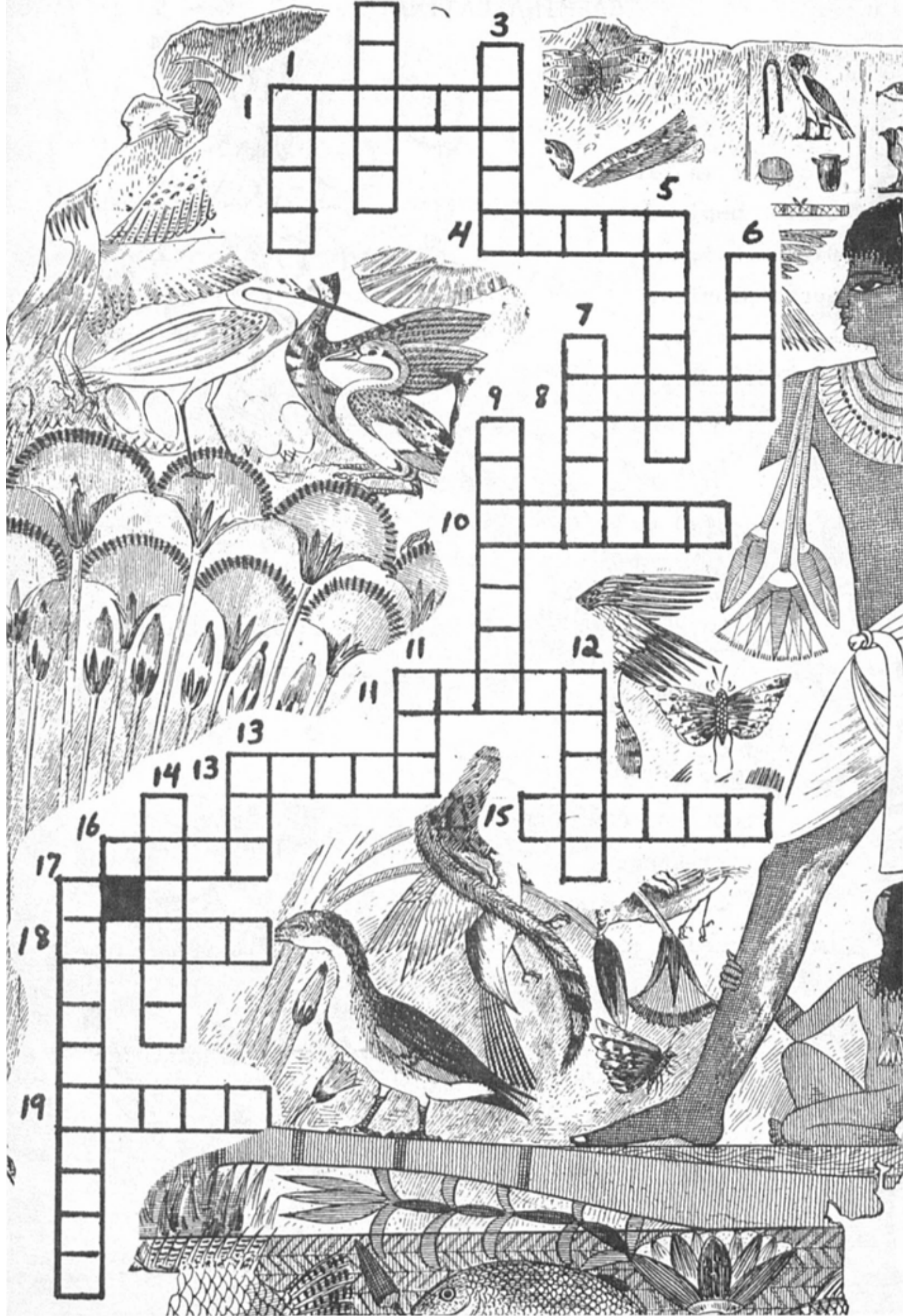

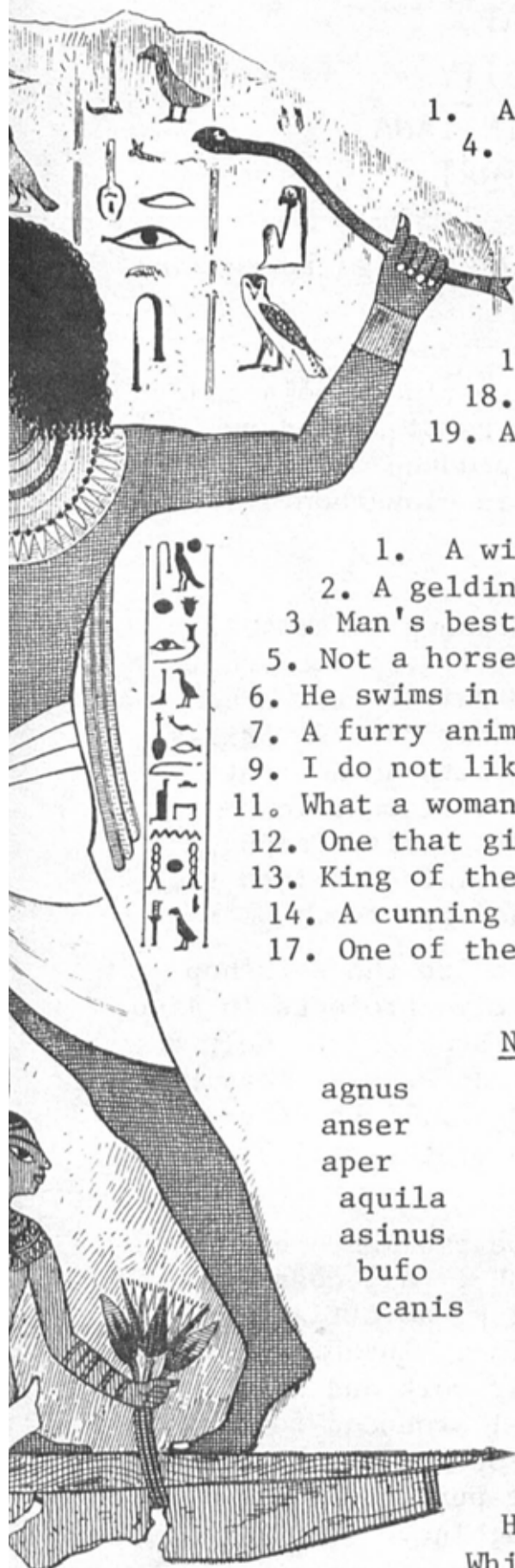

# CREATIVE MATERIALS WORKSHOP

TO BE HELD AT  
BUTLER UNIVERSITY  
INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA  
JULY 13-24, 1981

*to be conducted by B. F. Barcio, Director of Pompeiiana, Inc.*

## PURPOSES

To provide the instruction, setting, tools and incentive for creative teachers of secondary school Latin to compose and produce original materials for use in the Latin classroom.

## THE WORKSHOP

The official title of the Workshop is LT 402, Special Reading, and 3 hours of graduate credit may be earned through Butler University. The Workshop will meet daily, Monday through Friday, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with an hour off for lunch at noon. The class will meet in Room 263 of Jordan Hall on the Butler Campus, but projects may take the participants into the community for photography and research.

Participants are asked to come to the Workshop with a minimum of three creative projects in mind, and special guidance will be provided to help them select those projects which can be most feasibly completed and produced. Grades will be determined by the successful completion of the projects selected.

All materials created will be published by Pompeiiana, Inc. which will bear all costs of publication. Materials will be advertised and distributed by Pompeiiana, Inc. Authors will be given proper credit for their work and will receive one free copy of the material produced for their own use. Other copies will be sold by Pompeiiana, Inc. with all proceeds being put into the general operating fund of Pompeiiana, Inc.



## THE CREATIVE MATERIALS

Suggested areas for creative work at the Workshop include AV presentations, posters, displays, games, theatrical productions, promotional materials, arts and crafts projects (including artifact reproduction), special approaches for utilizing spoken Latin, for utilizing public community resources, for building community awareness programs, and for developing historical "personae" which teachers can enact in the classroom. Particular attention will be given to special interest projects of the participants so long as they are feasible, have rather wide-spread appeal, and can result in a publishable product.

## TUITION

Tuition for the two week, 3 credit hour workshop is \$150.00, \$75.00 of which will be due as an initial deposit when enrollment forms are returned.

## ENROLLMENT

Because of the intense nature of the workshop, enrollment will be limited to the first 20 participants who return their enrollment forms and the \$75 deposit. Should less than 5 participants enroll in the workshop, Butler University and Pompeiiana, Inc. reserve the right to cancel the workshop and return all deposits that were sent in.

## HOUSING - BOARD

Housing is available in Butler University dorms at the rate of \$6.00 per night for two-to-a-room accommodations. Those wishing a single room would pay \$12 per night. Cafeteria meals are available for \$10 a day with a meal ticket that can be purchased upon arrival.

## THE SOUTH CAROLINA

### JCL LATIN FORUM

The South Carolina JCL held the Latin Forum for this school year at Dreher High School on March 20. The Junior Classical League sponsors these contests yearly, and Latin students work toward this event throughout the year.

Over 700 students and teachers gathered for this year's contests. The clothing contests were for Minerva, a Gallic warrior, and Antony and Cleopatra for the couple contest. Written contests were held in derivatives, grammar, vocabulary, Roman history, mythology, and Roman daily life. In arts and crafts the categories included a mosaic, ink drawing, painting, needlework, sculpture/ceramics, T-shirt design, and a project of no larger size than one foot in any direction. A college bowl quiz, with four members of a team from a given school, four schools at a time compete in the certamen. There is a commercial contest where the school is allowed a 60-second time on stage to amuse and delight the audience.

For each contest three trophies are given plus a fourth place ribbon. It is quite an honor to win in these state contests. The written tests are made up by college professors who gather from around the state to act as judges.

The 1981 Latin Forum was organized and directed by Ms. Sally R. Westen, Latin teacher of Dreher High School. Ms. Westen grew up in Brazil, Indiana, where she was a graduate of Van Buren High School. This is the third year that she has held the Latin Forum at Dreher.
